## Who builds York County rail trails?

YCRTA unveiled

More and more visitors from near and far are enjoying the rail trails in York County—the 27-mile Heritage Rail Trail and the ever-expanding Hanover Trolley Trail. Did you ever wonder who built these rail trails? How were they created? Here's the long-kept secret.

York County rail trails come into existence through a huge volunteer effort led by York County Rail Trail Authority (YCRTA). York County Board of Commissioners formed the Authority in 1990, primarily to recruit a talented group of citizens to guide the conversion of a newly acquired section of the Northern Central Railway into a rail trail. The Authority set to work, and by August 1999 the Heritage Rail Trail (HRT) opened to the public.

Other notable successes include building the Heritage Rail Trail's northern extension to John Rudy County Park; restoring New Freedom and Hanover Junction Train Stations, Howard Tunnel, and numerous historic Northern Central Railway bridges. The Authority's work continues today with the development of the Hanover Trolley Trail (HTT).

YCRTA directs all stages of trail development from planning and land acquisitions to design, environmental permitting, and construction. Rail trails are not easy or cheap to build. It currently costs nearly \$1M to build one mile of new rail trail. Since 2021, YCRTA has brought over \$9M in grant money into York County to serve the recreational needs of our citizens and visitors.

The funds to develop York County rail trails come from a variety of sources, primarily grant money from state and federal agencies as well as generous contributions from local foundations and individuals.

# Project Updates

## Hanover Trolley Trail

#### New trail section officially opens near Spring Grove.

Mild winter weather has allowed trail construction to move quickly along a section of the dormant rail corridor from the railroad underpass in Spring Grove to Sunnyside Road in Jackson Township. As a result, the Hanover Trolley Trail has grown by another 2.1 miles!

Once a dormant rail corridor (top photo), Kinsley Construction Inc. has worked over the past ten months to install drainage systems (second photo) and the trail's subsurface (third photo.) "Trail Mix" surface, railings, retaining walls, and gates now complete the project (bottom photo).

Funded through state grants from the PA Department of Conservation & Natural Resource's Keystone Fund and the Department of Community & Economic Development's Local Share Account with matching local funds from Memorial Health Fund and Explore York, this 2.1-mile section of trail will open to the public on April 26. A public ceremony will begin at 11:30 AM on the rail trail in Spring Grove near the railroad underpass.

Many thanks to the Spring Grove community for their assistance to make the opening celebration possible, particularly to Spring Grove Borough, Spring Grove Regional Parks & Recreation, and Friendship Hose Company #1.





## Oil Creek Restoration

#### Focus shifts to Heidelberg Township.

York County Rail Trail Authority will now face a new challenge – restoring sections of Oil Creek and building additional miles of trail along the rail corridor. Because the creek channel has moved, deepened, and filled with sediment over the years, restoration of creek sections that parallel the rail corridor is necessary to protect the future trail.

The Authority awarded a contract to Aquatic Resource Restoration Corp. to complete the first of three phases of restoration. Work began in mid-April and will continue through the fall.

Funding of this \$1.2 M phase of creek work is made possible through





Today, the Authority consists of a team of ten volunteers and two part-time staff people, with offices in Hanover Junction

Train Station. Volunteers also serve on various committees including the planning committee, the HTT operating committee, the HTT development committee, and the ambassador committee. Friends of the YCRTA offers annual memberships to the public that support the work of the Authority.

YCRTA has two primary goals within the next 10 years: 1) to complete the Hanover Trolley Trail, and 2) to connect the Hanover Trolley Trail to the Heritage Rail Trail. The resulting trail system would then rival the trail systems in the Philadelphia and Pittsburgh areas—boosting York County's outdoor recreational economy, attracting a strong workforce, and serving the recreational needs of our residents.
